






Ramblin' NoDaks membership books for sale

FMCA National Director Report—John Emmett

Greetings from the Big Apple. I am in New York City visiting our daughter for Easter. New York is such an interesting place. Great to visit but not a place I personally would like to live.

Cathy and I had a very nice trip to Perry GA for FMCA's 106th International Convention and RV Expo. This is our fifth or sixth trip to Perry. It was a great experience and I encourage everyone to make a trip to Perry. The Georgia National Fairgrounds and Agricenter is an excellent venue for a rally of this type. In fact, Perry GA was the site of the largest FMCA rally in history with over 6,200 coaches in the late 1990's.

Check in at the rally was smooth and easy. We were parked on grass which always a little disconcerting with a coach as heavy as ours. We got about 2" of rain on Friday night. We left on Sunday morning and things were still pretty muddy.

I am going to quote some statistics from our Midwest Area meeting. At the Perry rally there were a little over 1,600 coaches. This is down from previous years but well over the number of coaches at the Lincoln NE rally in August.

Midwest Area Vice President John Jacobs reported at our meeting that approximately 16% of the FMCA membership are towable and that about 3% of all RV's nationwide are members of FMCA. All of these statistics are from memory as I don't have my notes here with me, but they are very close.

We all know Gary Milner. He is candidate for the office of International President. We will be voting on this at the rally in Gillette.

The entertainment was OK, not great. Wednesday evening was the Andrews Brother Dueling Pianos. Thursday night was the evening for Block Parties and there were several. A sock hop was also held on Thursday night. Friday night was Kenny Ray Horton. He performed in Lincoln at an afternoon show. We missed seeing him because it was raining bucket loads. And Saturday was Tom Becker who at one time was with the New Christy Minstrels. He did a tribute to John Denver. It was very enjoyable.

To finish up this recap, all of the usual vendors and seminars were available for all to attend. There were many first timers as well as seeing many old friends. Cathy and I look forward to the rally in Gillette. In fact, the registration is open and there will be many full hook-up sites available.

Crab Salad or Dip



It is an honor for me to introduce to you these two wonderful people from North Dakota. Gordon Wettlaufer is 91 years and 9 months old. Adeline Wettlaufer is 91 years and 10 months old. They have been married for 70 years and 8 months.

Gordy lived on a farm for 13 years and then moved to Bottineau, ND. At about 14 years old, in 1945, he started working at a grocery store. At that time, he received 20 cents per hour. At the age of 20, Gordon was drafted into the Marine Corp. In Gordon's words... "the best of the military!!". After Boot Camp, he came home on furlough and married the love of his life, Adeline Dunderland on June 2nd, 1952.

Adeline was a cute hometown Bottineau North Dakota girl. She spent her early years working and helping various people. She volunteered at her church. She was very involved in music at school and also the Valedictorian of her class.

Gordon returned to the service. He was stationed for 10 months in South Korea during the Korean Conflict. During the 2 years that Gordon was serving our country, Adeline was at home teaching 2nd Grade and keeping the home fires burning.

When Gordon came home from his military duties, they purchased a small run-down grocery store in their hometown of Bottineau, North Dakota in the year of 1954. Their first day of business, they sold \$47.00 of grocery. After lots of hard work, they moved across the street to a large building built by Nash Finch Company, and it became the Piggly Wiggly grocery store. This was a dream that they had really worked for. Gordon ran the store and Adeline did the bookwork and she also made many window banners and in-store signs for the shelves.

Ten years later, they built their own Piggly Wiggly store back across the street where it had all started 16 years prior in the little run-down store. They both state that they put in many long hours of hard work through the years, but it was worth it all. Business was good and the store did well, and they met many wonderful people along the way.

They sold their store and retired in 1984, both at the age of 53. After retiring, they began traveling in their motorhome. They spent about 2 weeks at a location and then moved on traveling between Florida and California and many places in between. Their travels have taken them to Alaska, to Europe multiple times, and on several cruises.

In 2012, at the age of 83, they decided to settle in one place for the winter and that is when they purchased their park model at Val Vista Villages. They say that it is a great place to live, enjoying old and new friends. They love the warm weather rather than the cold in North Dakota. They are both still very active. Gordon goes to pottery and the wood shop making beautiful vases, bowls and ink pens which many of us have been blessed to receive. Adeline loves to do puzzles, read and she is an accomplished piano player and still plays. She just played a duet with her daughter at her Granddaughter's wedding in New York. She makes the best divinity. Another blessing that many of us have received. They love gatherings and getting together to play games and cards. One of them can be quite competitive!

Gordon and Adeline have built a legacy of 4 wonderful children (2 boys and 2 girls), 10 smart Grandchildren, and 5 perfect Great Grandchildren. The love in their family is very obvious!

This couple is special beyond measure to many people. When they are in our midst, there is never a dull moment. They are still active in our North Dakota RV group, the Ramblin' NoDaks. In the summer months, Gordy still drives their 40' motorhome to our rallies at various locations. They keep busy in their hometown enjoying family, visiting, and volunteering.

So Happy Birthday to these two wonderful people that will soon be 92 years old! We treasure your friendship, and we love you dearly!
