RECIPES BY REQUEST

Crock Pot Breakfast Casserole

- 26 oz. frozen hash browns
- 1 c. milk
- 16 oz. ham, bacon, or sausage (cooked)
- 12 eggs
- 1 TBsp. ground mustard
- 16 oz. shredded cheddar cheese
- salt and pepper

Spread hash browns evenly on the bottom of the crock pot. Put meat on top of hash browns and put cheese on top of that. (Next time I will mix these 3 items in a bowl and put them in the crock pot). Mix eggs in bowl and add milk, mustard and plenty of salt and pepper. Pour egg mixture over the ingredients in the crock pot. Spread out evenly. Cook on low for 6-8 hours. You may also add salsa.

Devine Toffee Squares

- Bottom:** ½ c flour
 ¼ tsp. baking soda
 ⅓ c. packed brown sugar
 ⅓ c. melted butter
 pinch of salt
 ¾ c. rice krispies

Thoroughly combine all the above ingredients. Press into greased 8" pan. Bake at 350° for 10-15 minutes (until it starts to brown)

- Middle:** 1 can Eagle Brand
 ½ c. butter
 ½ c. packed brown sugar

Combine the 3 ingredients in heavy saucepan. Bring to a boil and boil for 5 minutes stirring continuously. Pour over crust.

- Top:** Melt 1 c. milk chocolate chips. Stir in ¼ c. rice krispies until well coated. Spread over caramel gently. Chill several hours to set.

**A MESSAGE FROM DUANE
OUR FMCA NATIONAL DIRECTOR**

Hello Everyone!

Our trip to Madison for the 92nd FMCA Family Reunion is over and it was a very good Convention as well as a fantastic trip. Our team, John & Pam, did a great job of arranging our rolling rally on the way there. It takes a lot of work and they certainly handled it well. The convention ended up with right at 1600 motor homes on site. Down a bit, but it was still a great gathering. Many RV displays and lots of vendors that all had great displays and products to sell.

The Governing Board had a good turnout with 68% of a possible 404 voting members present. With the President, Senior Vice President and Treasurer running unopposed, the election was over quick. There was a very close vote tally for the Secretary position between two very capable candidates, where Gayle Young ended up beating John Ferrari.

FMCA is still doing well. Operating on a seven million dollar budget with eleven (plus) million in invested reserves.

One very important item we need to be aware of is our free member benefit that we all receive as part of our annual dues, that is FMCAssist. If you are a paid up FMCA member or an Associate (if you can't drive anymore or don't own a motorhome anymore) you are covered as soon as you are 100 miles away from home no matter what mode of travel, on vacation, cruise, airplane — no matter what — homeland or abroad. If an incident happens call the medical authorities first and then call FMCAssist next before you make any other plans. Keep the following phone number with your important items 1-877-202-4176 for USA and Canada and 0-317-582-2619 to call Collect Worldwide. So if you need medical transportation, equipment returned, family, pets or companion transportation call these numbers. The company is Seven Corners and the word is, "Wesley" is the best Agent ever! At our Chapter meetings you will be hearing more about this from John, our President, I am sure. This program costs FMCA approximately 1/2 million dollars a year in premiums and that is paid for with part of our earnings from our investments.

Another new product available to us is FMCA Road Assist. You can learn more about this on page 19 of the new August issue of our FMCA magazine.

Both proposed amendment by-law changes, #1 (deals with chapter voting) and #2 (deals with temporary delegate appointment), were discussed at length and passed.

FMCA membership is constantly dropping, not from the lack of new members, but from existing members dropping out. Most of that is due to age, but also the members that don't belong to a chapter just need to be reminded of our fine organization's new benefits. By not belonging to a chapter and attending meetings they usually are not aware of these changes, unless they read the magazine regularly or are told so by us.
